

Wisteria Wow!

Wisterias offer a full spectrum of bloom colors. Stems of these vigorous vining plants are festooned with chains of fragrant blooms, in white, blue, lavender, pink or purple.



Amethyst Falls Wisteria (*Wisteria frutescens* 'Amethyst Falls') is smothered in May and June with mildly fragrant, lavender-blue flower clusters. The five-inch long blooms of this tough, adaptable, North American native vine recur through August. Vigorous but mannerly, it grows to about 15 feet and may be pruned as desired in early spring. Zone 5.



Branches of **Prolific Wisteria** (*Wisteria sinensis* 'Prolific') are covered with drooping racemes of purplish-blue flowers before the leaves emerge. It can be depended upon to bloom at a young age and will also flower sporadically until mid-summer.



Southern Belle Wisteria (*Wisteria sinensis* 'Southern Belle') sports lavender-blue racemes in May and continues to flower intermittently throughout the growing season. Plants bloom at an early age. It thrives in filtered to full sun.
